Behavioural Competencies

Coaches appointed must:

- Be prepared to accept the conditions of the appointment
- Uphold the mission, vision, and objectives of Manly Touch - www.manlytouch.com
- Adhere to the '*Manly Touch By-Laws*', '*Representative Selection Policy*', '*Code of Conduct*' and any other applicable policies and guidelines at all times (and policies of other third parties as required, such as NSWTA and TFA)
- Be accountable for the adherence to these same policies by players, player's families and team management
- Demonstrate the ability to work within the NSWTA '*Code of Conduct*' guidelines

- Possess strong communication skills
- Liaise with team management regarding administrative matters
- Be a positive role model in behavioural management, appearance and ethics at all times
- Demonstrate the ability to work well under pressure whilst achieving objectives
- Arrange regular team training sessions that provide direction to, and development of, all players
- Treat everyone fairly and with due respect at all times
- Show enthusiasm and enjoyment in coaching – make it fun!

Technical Skills

Coaches appointed must:

- Coach the team to which the appointment was made until the completion of the appointment, which is normally two weeks after the Junior State Cup
- Provide a record of coaching ability and results, which demonstrates a sound knowledge base of best practice touch football coaching
- Possess the required FTEM certification as advised by NSWTA (which is '*Foundation*' for U8 age groups and '*Talent*' for U10+ for JSC) - <http://touchfootball.com.au/coach/>
- Maintain and/or increase coaching credentials
- Have a valid Working With Children Check (in accordance with the NSW Office of the Children's Guardian - www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check)
- Complete the two online courses provided by 'Play by the Rules'; '*Child Protection*' and '*Harassment & Discrimination*' - <https://www.playbytherules.net.au/online-courses>
